

An extra from the office of the Baton Rouge Advocate, gives the following list of losses by the recent destructive fire at that place:

A. Matto, about \$12,000, not insured; R. Beal & Son, \$3,500, not insured; J. Huguet, between \$6000 and \$7000, insured for \$2000; J. Mansker, \$3000, not insured; T. Prendergrast, \$3000, not insured; J. & L. Florence, \$3000, insured; J. Tunnis, \$3000; J. Garvin, \$1000, not insured; A. Theriot, \$1000; John L. Wolf, \$3000; P. Foley, \$500, not insured; Mrs. Foster, \$2000; R. & F. Sans, \$4000; J. McCatop, \$1000; E. F. Phillips, \$2000; F. Vincent \$3000; L. Grandpre, \$1000; S. Bear, \$1000. There are other losses in furniture, &c., of which we are unable to form any thing like a correct estimate, but suppose they would reach \$2000, and probably \$3000. Many of the goods of W. D. Phillips were damaged in removing, and as is always the case on such occasions, there was more or less plundering going on. Col. Pratt, of the Harney House, informs us that the damage to that building will probably amount to \$1500.
