ble indemnity feature. Steele said.
The petition states Pamperin disappeared "under circumstances that leave no doubt" he is dead. It said he "was seen to be attacked and presumably devoured by a large white shark."
Mrs. Pamperin said in the petition that she cannot obtain a death certificate without the court action.
An affidavit from Pamperin's skin diving companion, Gerald Lehrer, 30, of 373 Greenville St., La Jolla, was attached to the petition. It attests that Lehrer witnessed the attack by a 20-foot shark.
Steele asked for an early hearing on the petition.

26 Pacific Beach Homeowners Ask \$270,000 For Flood Damage

Twenty-six Pacific Beach homeowners yesterday brought a Superior Court suit for \$270,250.38 as the result of alleged damage due to storm runoff from the La Jolla Palisades subdivision area Jan. 6.
The hillside subdivision is located on the southerly slope of Mount Soledad.
FOUR STREETS
Among the plaintiffs is Mrs. Carol C. Pamperin of 964 Bayard Pl. Her husband, Robert L. 33, was killed by a shark June 14 while skin-diving off La Jolla.
All of the plaintiffs live in the 800 and 900 blocks of Van Nuys street, the 5300 block of Cass street, the 800 and 900 blocks of Archer street, and the 900 block of Bayard place.
The suit complains that faulty construction on the slopes of Mount Soledad caused storm waters to swamp their properties with dirt, debris and rocks.
Named as defendants are La Jolla Palisades, an association of builders and developers; the Glen A. Rickard Engineering & Development Co.; the E. A. Irish and C. W. McGrath Construction company; and the city of San Diego.
Each plaintiff asks \$6,000.

Murder Trial In 3rd Day

The jury trial of Bayani Fernando Tobias, 25, accused of murder and assault with a deadly weapon, will begin its third day today in Superior Court.
Tobias is charged with murdering Clarence Ralph Mansker, 36, a bakery truck driver, and assault with a deadly weapon on Mansker's friend, Charles Darrell Swinney, 25, a driver's helper.
The shooting occurred outside the Log Hut beer bar at 1246 First Ave. early May 11. Tobias, a sailor attached to the submarine tender Neurus, allegedly shot Mansker and Swinney for breaking up a quarrel he was having with a woman.
The group's attorney, Arnold O. Steele, said the special damages are sought to cover the cost of cleaning up and repairing the properties.
The Pamperin's property was among the least damaged. Mrs. Pamperin asks \$290 in special damages.
The court is asked to issue an injunction ordering the defendants to install proper drainage facilities on the hillside.

BELL SIGNS CHANGE DUE

Assemblyman Jack Schrade (R-El Cajon) announced yesterday that replacement of mission bell signs along historic El Camino Real would begin here July 24.
He said the first bell would be installed alongside U.S. Highway 101 just north of Rosecrans street at 2 p.m. A program for the event is now being arranged, he said.
Schrade said no extra appropriations were necessary for the replacement program.

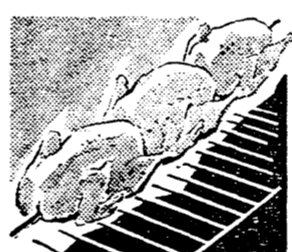

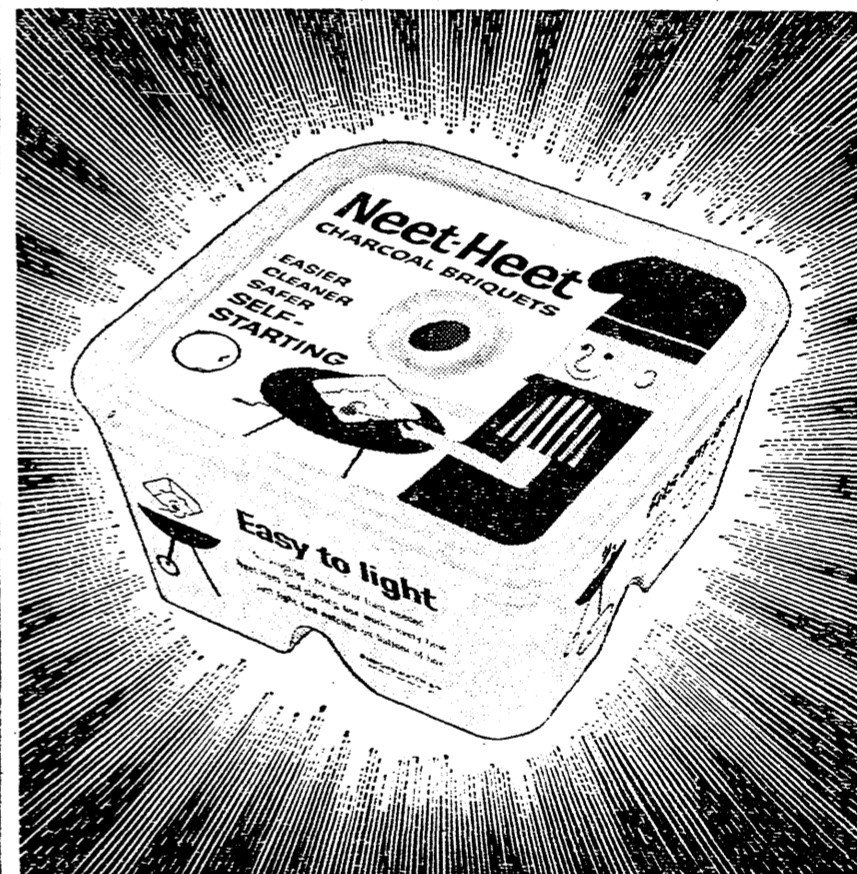
