Death Takes

Congressman From Wisconsin Dies

WASHINGTON, April 29.—(AP)—Representative Reid F. Murray, Republican, Wisconsin, died early today in Bethesda Naval Hospital of nephritis. He was 64 and was serving a second term in Congress.

Before his election to Congress, Murray was agriculture agent for the Bank of Oshkosh. Prior to that, he held a similar job with the Northern Pacific Railway Co., and had been county agent in Winnebago County. He was a graduate of the University of Wisconsin and had taught there for five years, 1922 to 1927.
