Lindvall, Anderson Qualify for Finals

CHAMPAIGN—Paul Lindvall, Mount Morris high jumper, and Jim Anderson, Kaneland shot putter, were the only area individuals to qualify Friday for berths in the state track and field finals here today.

They will join Auburn's two relay teams and the area's half-milers and milers in competition in the University of Illinois' Memorial Stadium here today.

Anderson had a toss of 57.3, the third best of day here, in the preliminaries of the shot put.

Lindvall, who was fifth in the state high jump with a leap of 6-3 a year ago, cleared 6-10.5 in the preliminaries of the 13-man finals in the event.

West's Greg Austin cleared 6-0, but missed at 6-1, the height required to jump in today's finals.

Gusty Wind Sends Scores Soaring

CHAMPAIGN—Gusts of wind up to 35 miles per hour sent scores soaring here Friday in the first round of the state high school golf tournament at the University of Illinois Orange Course.

Only one golfer in the field of more than 100 was able to break 80 as the flat, par 72 course which measures 6,633 yards took its toll among the best prep players in the state.

Winnetka New Trier East grabbed the team lead with a four-man average of 84.4 while Jerry Glenn of Cartersville carded seven-over-par 79 to snare the individual lead.

Rockford Guilford and Freeport, the Big Eight Conference's two representatives in the 36-hole medal play tournament, found themselves far down the list after the first 18 holes.

Guilford had a 353 total—an average of 88.3 strokes per man—to pull into a four-way tie for 10th place with Galesburg, Palatine and LaGrange.

Freeport was all alone in 14th, one stroke behind with a 354 total—an 88.5 per man average.

New Trier East, which totaled 337, will be trying to protect a nine-stroke advantage in today's final 18-hole round over the same wind-swept course.

Richwoods NINTH Peoria Heights Richwoods, the pre-tournament favorite on the basis of its 304-district total and a victory in the Champaign invitational on the same course earlier this spring, was ninth with 352.

Glenn, who had the best district qualifying score (71), had a one-stroke lead on William Dutch of Glenbard West, who carded 40-40-80.
