forehead off the floor when he hit and was down for several moments, right photos. He continued without a

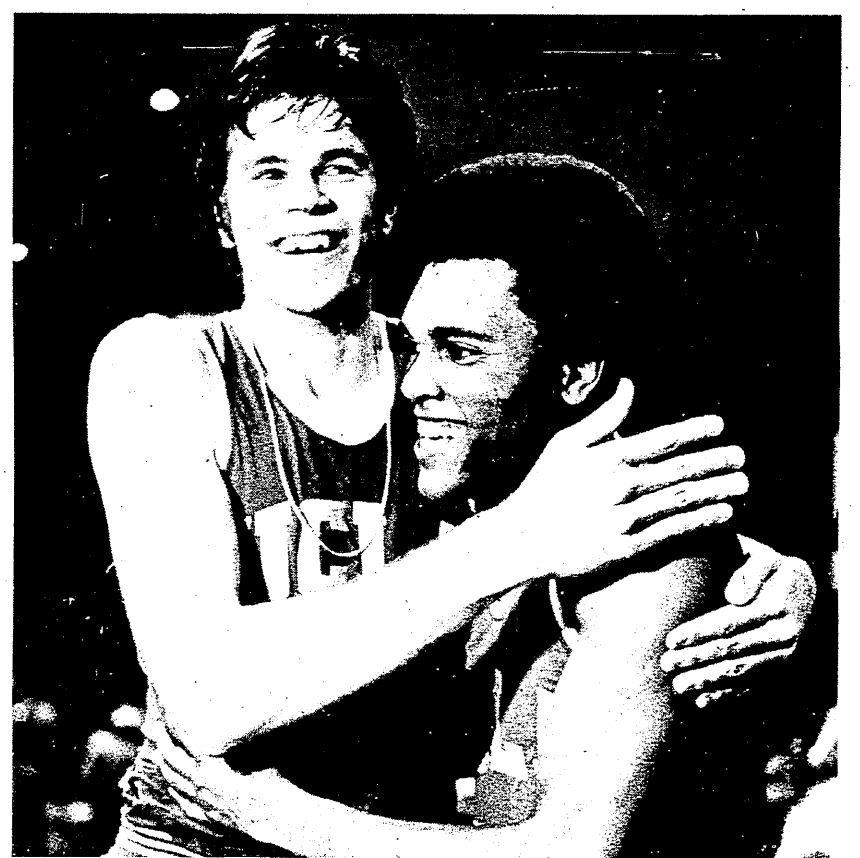
break, however, and finished the night with 24 points as UCLA won its 10th NCAA title, 92-85.

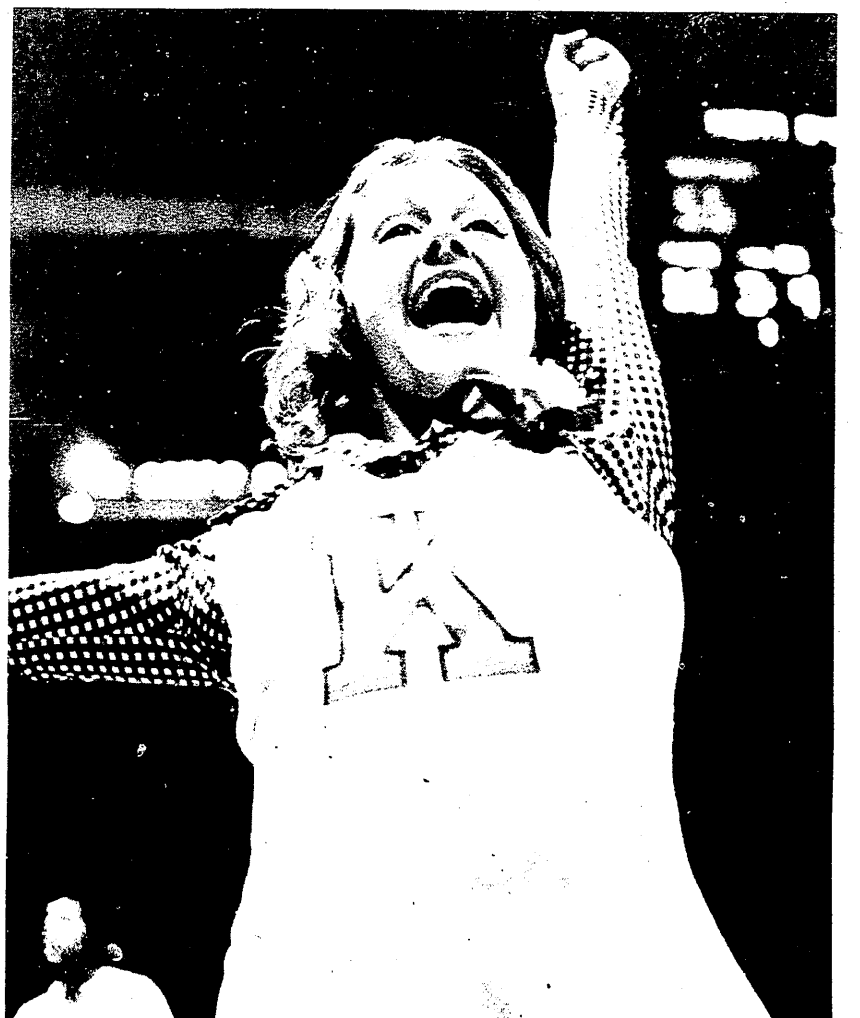
