

FOUR ARRESTED

Four young men, James Samples, George Bealin, Charles McDaniel and Earl Laurence, none more than 23 years old, were captured early Sunday morning in the scrap yard of the Southern Trading Company at the intersection of Lamar street and the T. & P. tracks, by W. C. Lucas and A. J. Mansker, special agents for the T. & P. company. They are charged with burglarizing freight cars.

Complaints charging them with burglary were filed Monday morning in the county court.

Joe Dworkin, a Main street second-hand dealer, was arrested on Monday morning by the police and a complaint charging receiving and concealing stolen property issued against him.

An indirect result of the arrest of Dworkin is a charge of affray now pending against L. H. Dillard, chief special agent for the T. & P.

Dworkin's uncle, Sam Dworkin, and the officer became involved in a fight in front of the city hall Monday morning when the relative of the second-hand man went to police headquarters to investigate the nature of the charge against the prisoner. Police officers intervened and ordered Dworkin to leave. Dillard insisted upon making bond on a charge of affray.
