

Marine Unit Faces Readiness Check

 WASHINGTON — A readiness reporting system troller General Joseph Campbell has informed Congress that his office will soon make a new check of the 3rd Marine Division to make certain its equipment is combat ready.

Campbell, who heads the General Accounting Office, said in a letter to Congress that combat vehicles and equipment of the division, stationed on Okinawa, were in unsatisfactory condition during most of 1962 and were permitted to remain that way for extended periods.

Campbell said it was not until after a second GAO review in October, 1962, that the Marines took corrective action.

ACTION TAKEN

He said a January, 1963, review disclosed the division "had taken and was continuing corrective action on the basis of actions originally initiated by the Marine Corps and the additional proposals we had made." As a result, he said, the division's equipment readiness had been substantially improved.

U.S. Sues Nickel Firms Linked To Humphrey

 WASHINGTON—The Justice Department yesterday filed suit to recover \$1.8 million in alleged overcharges on government nickel contracts with mining companies once controlled by former Treasury Secretary George M. Humphrey.

The contracts were the center of a controversy a year ago during a Senate investigation of government stockpiling of strategic materials. The government said yesterday that because of incorrect accounting, it had been overcharged \$1,816,798 for nickel already delivered. About 17 million pounds remain to be delivered.

The case was referred to the Justice Department April 22 after the General Services Administration failed to collect the money, a spokesman said.

The suit, filed in Portland, Ore., named as defendants the Hanna Nickel Smelting Co. and the Hanna Mining Co.
