

*Loss of the Steam-Boat Tennessee.*—On the 6th ult the steam-boat Tennessee, Capt Campbell, from N. Orleans, left Natchez, bound up the Mississippi. She had on board a cargo estimated at 80,000 dols. value, and 180 passengers—About 180 miles above Natchez, she struck a log in the river which penetrated the hull, and she sunk soon after. The night was boisterous and gloomy, with a heavy fall of snow. About 30 of the passengers were drowned. The remainder got on shore where they suffered much from cold in the marshes before morning. Among the persons lost were M Nouvelle of Lexington, J. W. Poole of Baltimore, J. Maybin of Philadelphia, M Caruthers of Tennessee; Mrs. Mansker and child, George Sanders, Samuel Cooper, David Nave, J Kisby, S. Hencely, A. Stewart, 1st engineer, J. Kelper, 2d do. — Terley, fireman, one black man, and 2 or 3 black women.
