Mrs. Scarpitti also was a member of the National City Chamber of Commerce, South San Diego Bay Cities Board of Realtors, the HOH Club of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Fraternity of Christian Doctrine.

Surviving are her husband, Vito; a daughter, Mrs. Constance Mesker; a son, Stephen, all of National City, and five grandchildren.

San Diego Record Set In Fire Loss

San Diego fires caused 29 deaths and destroyed property worth \$2.8 million in 1969, Fire Chief Leonard T. Bell reported yesterday.

The number of lives lost and the value of property destroyed were the highest ever, Bell said. The total number of fires during the year — 7,689 — also was listed as a record high.

The San Diego Fire Department completed 100 years of service in 1969. Bell said the city's dollar loss per capita in fires remained among the nation's lowest.

9 MORE DIE
Fire took nine more lives in 1969 than in 1968. The previous record for deaths was 28 in 1955.

Injuries caused by fire in 1969 numbered 502, including 341 firemen. None of the persons killed were firemen.

Bell said that 16 of the 29 fire fatalities resulted from careless smoking.

The department responded to 11,917 alarms. Four of the missions were for three-alarm blazes, 70 for bomb scares and 504 for first aid and rescues.

FALSE ALARMS UP
There were 1,015 false alarms in 1969, an increase of 38 percent over 1968.

Purposely set grass, brush and rubbish fires numbered 2,767, or 69 percent of the fires in that category.

The total of 7,689 fires was 9.5 percent higher than the 1968 figure of 7,012. Structural fires went from 2,271 in 1968 to 2,374 in 1969.

Per capita fire loss climbed from \$2.57 in 1968 to \$4 in 1969. The biggest losses last year were \$170,000 from a two-alarm Dryer Furniture Co. blaze in February and \$122,500 from a three-alarm apartment fire on Third Avenue in September.

"The parents, friends and other adults at the dinner may listen, but my talk will be specifically to the young folks because I enjoy most talking to them," Hill said.

The banquet will be a Father-Son Sea Cadet Banquet, sponsored by the San Diego Council of the Navy League. Dinner will be served at 7:30 p.m. About 300 persons are expected.

Cmdr. Robert L. Murphy, USN, ret., president of the Navy League council, will be master of ceremonies.

Cruise Ship Traffic Here Increasing

San Diego is becoming a popular port of call for cruise ships involving four lines, American President Lines, Matson Navigation Co., the West Lines and P & O Lines.

The latest steamship company to apply for berthage space is the Transmarine Navigation Co. This company will bring the 20,000-ton Carla C here Dec. 15. The Carla C is 600 feet long and has accommodations for several hundred passengers.

The liner Monterey arrived from Acapulco and Mazatlan yesterday, disembarking 53 passengers and taking aboard 21.

She will return here April 25 on another cruise to the Mexican ports.

The round-the-world liner Oriental Carnival is due Saturday with a cargo of plywood, textiles, candles and toys. Several passengers will go aboard here.

The steamer Golden Bear will load 20,000 bags of powdered milk at the 10th Avenue Marine Terminal next week. The milk is destined for Pakistan.

The Japanese Transport Ministry has ordered all ships similar in structure to the California Maru to be checked and if necessary reinforced.

The 55,000-ton California Maru, loaded with ore, sank off the coast of Japan in a February storm. Seven of the crew were lost.

Sixteen owners of 69 vessels were ordered to have their ships checked. Each ship is more than 500 feet long and in excess of 50,000 tons.

The order also said that the number of life rafts on the ships should be increased and better rescue programs should be instituted.

The California Maru was the fourth vessel lost in the same area within a year.

The Universe Iran, the sixth and last order of Gulf Oil Co. for 325,000-ton tankers, was christened last week at Nagasaki. The vessel will transport crude oil from the Persian Gulf to Bantry Bay, Ireland.
