County Fair Queen Busy With Duties

ENCINITAS — Dorothy Jean Wanket, 17, thinks being queen of the County Fair is "wonderful"—although she's found plenty of work—as well as glamour—comes with the job.

"Everyone is so nice and I like excitement," the lovely young brunet said after two weeks of personal appearances, interviews, luncheon speeches, giving autographs and posing for pictures.

Her time is booked solidly with similar engagements for the next two weeks before the 10-day County Fair opens at Del Mar June 26.

Dorothy is one of 12 youngsters in the Wanket family. Her father, Emil, is a building contractor. She was chosen official hostess at the fair from among 27 of the County's most beautiful girls.

At a brief opening day ceremony Miss Wanket will receive a key to the fairground.

The poised and soft-spoken queen will make at least 100 official appearances, 10 each day, at fair events ranging from style shows to the junior livestock exhibition.

Everything from fire eaters to Samoan dancers will be incorporated in Camp Pendleton's Force Troops Variety Club which will present one of the most elaborate shows at the fair, according to Special Events Director Jack Harrington.

Also featured in the all-marine review are a unicyclist, a mag-

ician, a 14-piece band and a host of musical soloists, including Pfc. Frank Strand, harmonica artist who has appeared with major orchestras.

State to Study Route

SOLANA BEACH—State highway officials will study an inland coastal freeway route, suggested by the Santa Fe Irrigation District, after the La Mesa controversy over freeway Highway 94 is settled, Hershell Larrick, a district director, said yesterday.

"We are anxious for a decision by the state on the route we suggested before the area south of Leucadia to San Diego gets too far developed," Larrick stated.

The proposed route runs parallel to Highway 101, roughly a mile inland. Four years ago the irrigation district offered more than a mile of right-of-way for the freeway for a nominal sum. Only recently the offer was referred to E. E. Wallace, state district highway engineer in San Diego.

Death Hearing Set

OCEANSIDE — Preliminary hearing for Marine S/Sgt. Clayton J. Alverson, 29, on a manslaughter charge filed in connection with the death of M/Sgt. John W. Havens, was set for June 30 yesterday in Municipal Court. Alverson's car collided with another May 11 on the San Luis Rey Rd. Havens was a passenger in the second car.

Dams on Farms To Be Assessed

Soil conservation dams that impound water for irrigation or fishing will be assessed for county taxes along with other farm improvements, Crowell D. Eddy, county assessor, yesterday told directors of the County Farm Bureau at a meeting in the Chamber of Commerce.

Catch basins that serve only to conserve run-off from winter rains will not be taxed, Eddy explained.

An increase averaging 20 percent in assessed valuation of farm improvements is being made this year to equalize value of improvements and land and is not intended to provide increased tax revenue, Eddy said.

Fred Yasukochi, of San Luis Rey, reported farmers in the vicinity of Mexico City are producing high quality strawberries from plants of the Lassen variety, developed by the University of California. With plenty of frost-free land, Mexico may become a large-scale producer of winter fruits and vegetables in competition with California, according to Yasukochi.

Directors approved a Farm Bureau strawberry section, headed by George Nagata, of San Luis Rey.

Water Bill Hearing Set

Cooler Press Leased Wire WASHINGTON, June 11—The House Interior Committee will hold hearings beginning June 22 on a bill by Rep. Clair Engle (D-Calif.) to enable California irrigation districts to build water distribution systems with federal financing.

The hearing was set by Chairman A. L. Miller (R-Neb). Engle said his bill would make interest-free government funds available as they are now under reclamation law. Users would be required to repay the capital loan only. "The purpose of this legislation," Engle explained, "is to save the taxpayers money by eliminating the excessive administrative and overhead costs which experience has shown occur when the federal government, instead of the local irrigation districts, build water distribution systems."

Head-on Collision of Sedan, Truck-Tanker Kills 2 Men

EL CENTRO—Vernon Lee Miller, 35, of San Bernardino, and David A. Mercado, 21, of Fort Worth, were killed early yesterday when their sedan collided head-on with a weed oil truck-tanker five miles south of the Riverside County line on Highway 99. Melvin J. Guyman, 31, of Los Angeles, driver of the tanker, was only slightly hurt.

Deputy Coroner O. R. Jones said tire tracks indicated Miller possibly fell asleep and his vehicle veered into the wrong line of traffic. Bodies of Miller and Mercado were taken to the W. I. Hoopes Mortuary at Brawley.

Carrot Shipping Drops
EL CENTRO—Imperial Valley will wind up its carrot season with a total of 5232 carloads shipped to outside markets by rail through June 10. A year ago for the same period, the total was 6285 carloads. The Federal State Market News at Brawley reported that only four sheds in the valley are continuing to process carrots and these probably will close soon.

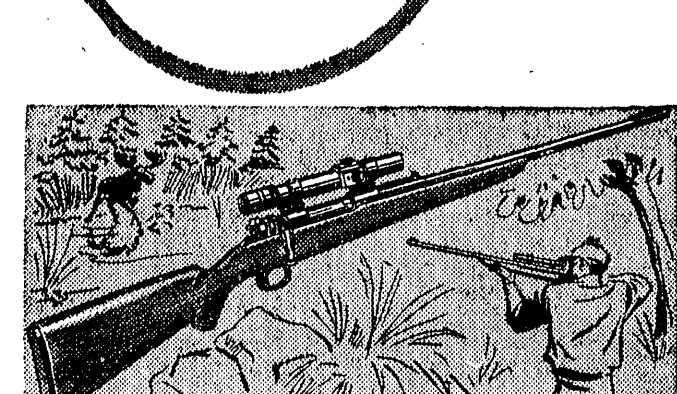
