

# Players' group slated to present musical 'Annie'

SANDY — The first of six week-end performances of the Sandy Community Players' production of the Broadway musical comedy "Annie" will be presented at 8 p.m. Friday in the Sandy Union High School Auditorium, 17100 N. Bluff Road.

Featured in the title role of Annie is 11-year-old Betsy Dethman of Portland, while Mark Papworth of Portland plays the role of Oliver "Daddy" Warbucks. Terilyn Myers-Newcomb of Brightwood plays Miss Hannigan.

The musical, which is directed by Steve Christensen of Sandy, Tom TenEyck of Sandy and Larry Leedy of Boring, has an unusually large and somewhat eclectic cast that includes 17 adults, 14 children and two dogs.

"Sandy Community Players have put on more than 60 shows during the past 10 years, but 'Annie' is the most spectacular and ambitious musical production we have ever attempted," said producer Jan Jacqua of Sandy.

After the Friday evening opening, the troupe will again perform "Annie" July 3 and July 4; as well as July 10 and July 11.

All performances will be staged in the high school auditorium.

An earlier 7 p.m. curtain time is scheduled for the July 4 show so that the audience will be able to attend the community's annual fireworks display in the Sandy High School football stadium after the play.
