

Parkrose High slates auction to help drug fight

An auction to benefit three Parkrose School District anti-drug and anti-alcohol programs will be held Friday evening in the Parkrose High School cafeteria, 11717 N.E. Shaver St.

A preview of the items for sale will begin at 7 p.m., with a verbal auction to start at 8 p.m. There will be a silent auction from 7 to 8 p.m. Auctioneer will be Bob Hanel, a Parkrose High School counselor.

The evening also will feature a raffle in which a used Datsun station wagon, donated by the Walt Johnson Lincoln Mercury dealership, and nine other prizes will be given away.

Entertainment will be provided by a Parkrose High School psychology teacher, Frank Perry, on the piano. District patron Eldon Rose will also bring in a troupe to demonstrate Korean martial arts.

Nancy Reagan, Robert Redford, Carol Burnett, Tom Selleck and local personalities are among celebrities who autographed T-shirts to be auctioned off.

Other items up for bid will include dinners at a variety of local restaurants, overnight stays at Oregon resorts, a set of tires, gift certificates for groceries, jewelry, a briefcase and pizzas.

Chris Gorchels, assistant principal at Parkrose High School, said money raised from the auction would go to the school's assistance program, which is designed to help students recovering from alcohol and drug abuse, and to the Parkrose chapter of Students Against Driving Drunk.

Money will also go to start up a new anti-drug program at the high school. Gorchels said Parkrose hoped to become heavily involved in the program under which all east county high

schools would train students to talk to elementary-age pupils about drug abuse.

Oregon Free From Drug Abuse has received a \$15,000 grant from International Business Machines, which will go toward starting up the program in east county, Gorchels said. Funding will go toward a two-day training session May 1-2 for the high school students, plus materials the students will take into the elementary schools.

Gorchels said the anti-drug and anti-alcohol programs at Parkrose High School had made a tremendous impact on the problem.

"We've really turned a corner; there have been no drinking-related deaths at Parkrose High School for three years," he said. "The key, more than anything, is getting the peer involvement, because students are going to listen to other students."
