U. D. C. to Sponsor Historical Films

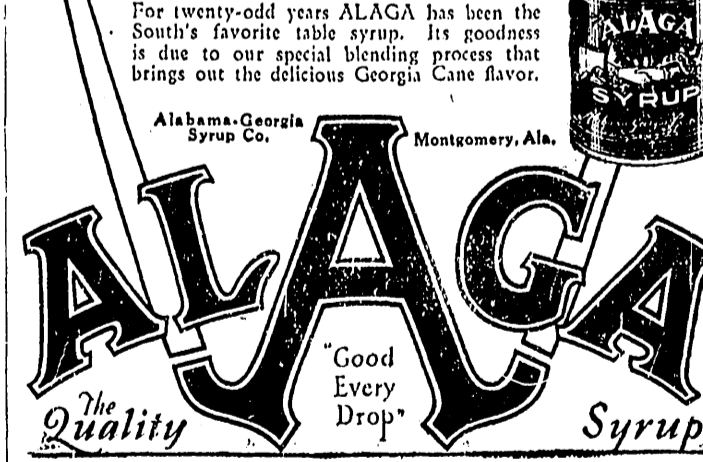
