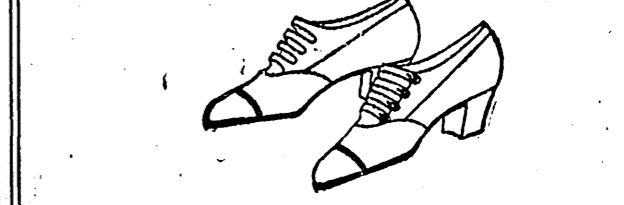
HANDSOME PRIZE FOR BENEFIT CARD PARTY
