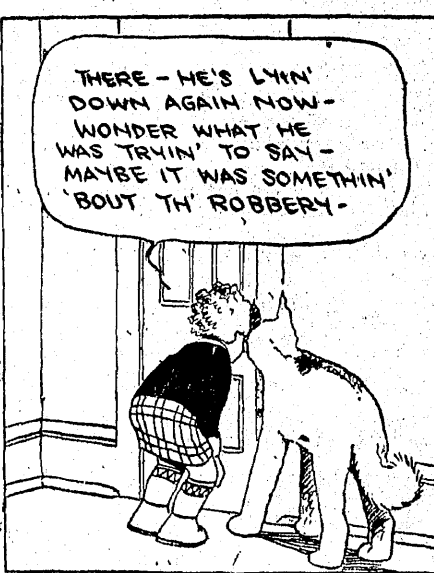
Prize Opera Will Make Trans-Continental Tour

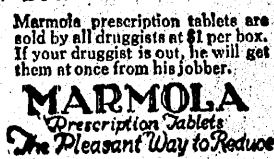

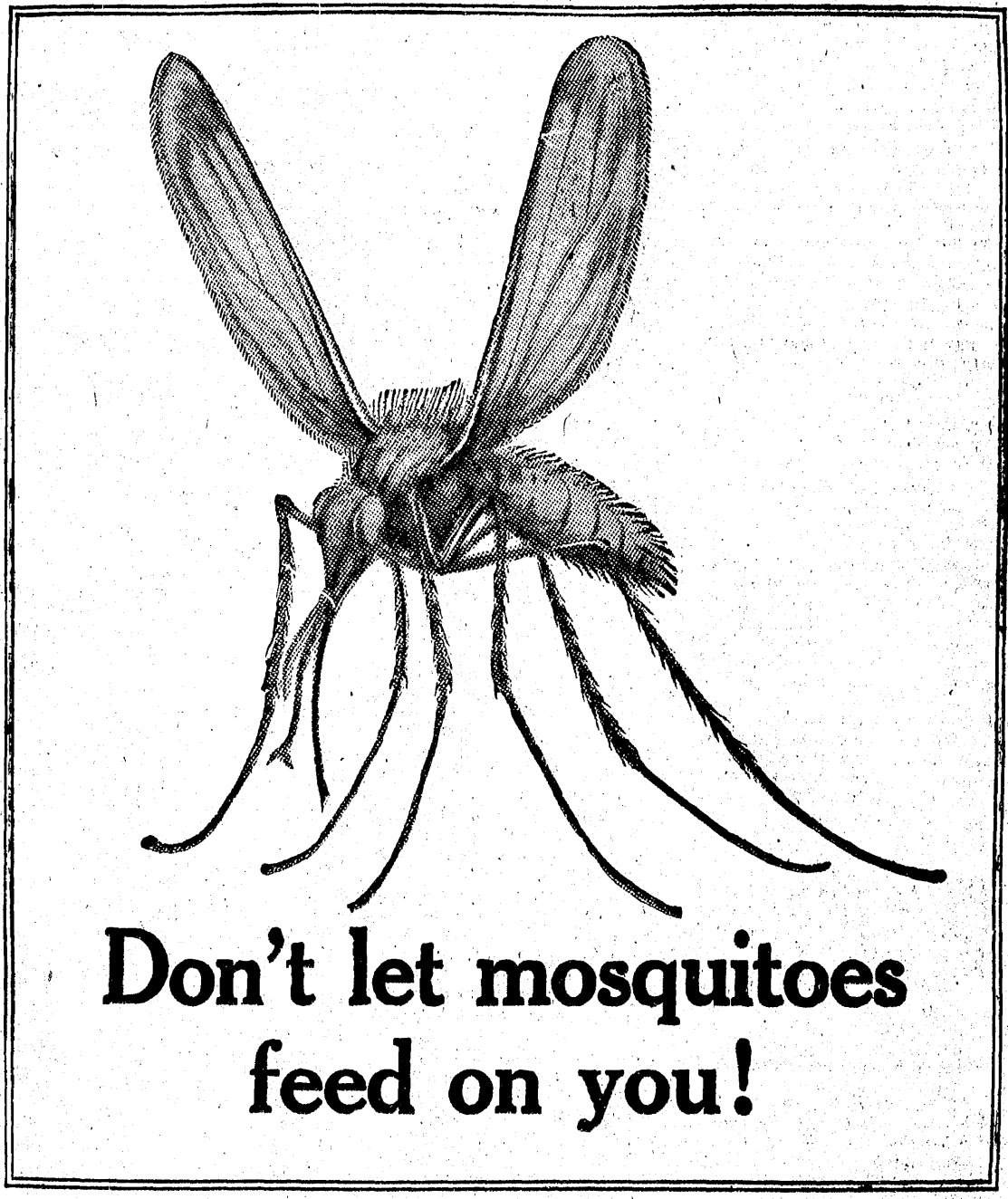
Golden Ray Club Gives Party for Mrs. Ayala
