Mansker burried to the central police station and reported the shooting to Assistant Chief Speight, Mounted

lice station and reported the shooting to Assistant Chief Speight. Mountain Policemen Traxler and Defec of the Missouri avenue station arrested the pegro on a charge of assault to murder.

The trouble started. Mansker says,

when he followed blackburn's stepson bome after watching him jump from a total car. Mansker went into the house and seized the boy by the shoulder. Blackburn, according to Mansker, shot at the officer before the later could unbutton his overcoat and reach

for his own wearon.
