

INFANT SCALDED

**Party Line
Delays Call;
Baby Dies**

SACRAMENTO, Nov. 21 (AP)—A year-old boy was scalded to death today in a bathtub. His mother said a party line telephone call delayed her plea for help.

The mother, Mrs. Carroll Mansker, said she left the boy, William, in about six inches of luke warm water with his brother, Carroll Jr., 2 while she went to the living room to care for another child.

She said she ran to the bathroom after Carroll called and found the younger child lying in the tub with hot water running on him.

Mrs. Mansker ran to a neighbor's home to telephone a doctor. She said she was delayed by two women talking on the party line. She said one woman hung up when she said her son was hurt but that the other refused and that a man eventually came on the line and argued with her. The mother then went to another neighbor's home to phone.

She estimated it took 20 minutes before she could call an ambulance. The boy was dead upon arrival at a hospital. The sheriff's office said it will investigate the telephone delay.

**3 Jet Crashes Kill
Navy, Marine Pilots**

ALBUQUERQUE, Nov. 21 (AP)—Three jet fighters, one reportedly carrying a mock atomic weapon, crashed in the West today, killing all three of the pilots.

A Navy F7U3 Cutlass and two Marine Corps fighters were involved. The Navy plane and one of the Marine jets crashed near Albuquerque.

The body of the third marine pilot was found in the wreckage of his plane near Needles, Calif.

An Air Force source said the Cutlass, which crashed 12 miles southwest of Albuquerque near Isleta Indian pueblo, was carrying an A-bomb "shape"—a copy of the atomic bomb used in ballistics tests. Navy and Air Force officials declined to confirm the report.

BODY FOUND
The plane was smoking as it headed into a rough area of the Isleta Indian reservation. Witnesses said it exploded and

burned on impact. The body of the pilot, Navy Lt. Frank A. Downs, 32, of Albuquerque, stationed at nearby Kirtland Air Force Base with a naval special weapons section, was found half a mile from the crash area.

A few hours after the Navy plane crashed, a Marine Corps F9F5 jet crashed in a mountainous section 2½ miles east of Albuquerque, killing the pilot. Navy officials said it hit in a small arroyo. The pilot's name was withheld pending notification of his next of kin.

LAND SAFELY
The F9F5 was one of a flight of four en route from El Toro Marine Corps Air Base in California to Albuquerque. Two of them landed here.

The third crashed 12 miles east of Needles, according to a spokesman at Luke Air Force Base in Arizona. The pilot's name also was withheld.

**C47 Carrying Four
Missing On Test Flight**
REYKJAVIK, Iceland, Nov. 21 (AP)—A U.S. C47 transport plane carrying four men disappeared today on a test flight. The plane was expected to land at Keflavik Airport at 2 p.m. Observers there saw it high over the field at 1:12 p.m. and tried to contact the crew by radio, but received no answer.

**Heir's Wife
Sues Pianist
Over Slap**

JANESVILLE, Wis., Nov. 21 (AP)—Mrs. Horace Dodge, wife of the heir to an auto fortune, today filed a \$200,000 damage suit accusing a Spanish musician of striking her in a restaurant.

The suit, filed in Rock County Circuit Court, named Mario Escudero, 27, as the defendant.

Mrs. Dodge said the incident occurred Friday at a Beloit, Wis., restaurant where she was singing "just for fun" with a trio. She said Escudero came to the restaurant after playing an engagement at another place.

A customer, she said in her complaint, asked her to sing in Spanish. When she declined, on grounds that she knew no Spanish, Escudero hit her, she said.

Escudero told reporters in Detroit, where he is appearing as pianist with a dance troupe, that he thought Mrs. Dodge was a hostess.

"I tried to ignore her until she insulted me in French and then swung me around and struck me," he said.

San Diego judge says border closing would be cheaper than hospitals for narcotics addicts—Page a-17

CHICAGO, Nov. 21 — Mrs. Miss Marcus said she came to Chicago in 1946 and switched to heroin in 1948. She said heroin is easy to buy in Chicago and costs her \$40 to \$50 a day or \$12 for one sixteenth of an ounce, compared with \$70 to \$80 a year ago. She said prices continue to decline. She said she buys regularly from 10 peddlers in the South Side Negro district and can order by phone.

Mrs. Rochlin told Sen. Daniel (D-Tex.), the subcommittee chairman her career ended after she was arrested with Robert Mitchum, an actor, for smoking marijuana. She was sentenced to 60 days in a California jail. She said she turned to heroin after she was released from jail.

Mrs. Rochlin said she gave up narcotics following treatment in a Chicago hospital but began using heroin again on a 1953 trip to California. She said she spent seven and a half months at the federal narcotics hospital in Lexington, Ky., last year. "But I went right back to heroin the moment I got out," she said.

Mrs. Rochlin, the mother of two children, said she and her husband, a musician, stopped using narcotics last February when they were spending \$300 a day for heroin. "It is a struggle almost every day," she said, to refrain from using them.

Another witness, Miss Diana Marcus, 40, said she quit working as a nurse and became a prostitute 21 years ago in Detroit because she needed more money after becoming addicted to morphine.
