Noble Victory Heads Field

DU QUOIN, Ill. (AP) — Noble Victory and Armbro Flight, each with sensational streaks, headed a field of 11 3-year-old trotters named Sunday for the 40th edition of the Hambletonian, the biggest prestige event in harness racing.

With a field of 11 starters in the betless race Wednesday over the lightning-fast mile oval of the Du Quoin State Fairground, the gross worth will be \$122,245. It makes the Hambletonian the richest trotting spectacular of the season. The winner's share will be \$59,900 with \$29,950 for second, \$14,376 for third, \$9,584 for fourth and \$3,990 for fifth.

Noble Victory, with earnings of \$280,366, becomes the richest entry in Hambletonian history. Armbro Flight has earnings of \$184,633.

Noble Victory owned by K. D. Owens, a Houston geologist-oil man, drew a favorable No. 6 pole position. Armbro Flight, bearing the colors of the Armstrong brothers of Brampton, Ont., will be in the No. 10 spot.

This is on the far outside in the first tier which numbers 10 horses. The one horse behind at No. 11 is Poplar Jamie from the Airin Stable of New York City and Silver Pine Acres of Pompano Beach, Fla.

Seeking First Win In reining Noble Victory, the 38-year-old Stanley Dancer will be seeking his first Hambletonian triumph. This is the only big one to escape him. Last year, he became the first man in the sulky sport to drive winners of more than a million dollars in one season.

Noble Victory has lost only one heat in 28 starts and has a string of 20 victories including nine this season. The big brown colt also has the best time of any Hambletonian nominee with 1:59 3-5 in the recent Review Futurity in Springfield, Ill.

In unofficial odds at the Fairgrounds, where a pari-mutuel wagering is prohibited by state law, Noble Victory was listed at 1-2.

O'Brien, who won the Hambletonian with Scott Frost in 1955 and Blaze Hanover in 1960, will try to bring Armbro Flight to her 23rd straight victory, dating back to last year and including 12 this season.

The towering black filly has been beaten only six times in 38 starts. Armbro Flight's unofficial odds are 3-1. Third choice is Short Stop at 7-2.
