

Romance Started at Murder Probe Leads to Wedding

A romance begun over a year ago at the grand jury investigation of the Hays-Boswell killing culminated Sunday when A. J. Mansker and Mrs. Bertha Newton were married at 7 p. m. at the residence of the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Skaggs, 201 Missouri avenue. Mansker is a special officer for the Texas & Pacific and his bride has been the telephone operator at the information bureau at the Texas & Pacific passenger station.

Mrs. Newton began services at the information bureau a few days prior to the shooting of Superintendent Boswell. Both she and Mansker were summoned to appear before the grand jury and while waiting in the corridor of the courthouse to take their turns in the grand jury room they became acquainted. From that time until the wedding of Sunday the special officer detailed himself to do considerable guard duty at the information cage where Mrs. Newton was employed.

Only the intimate friends of the couple were present. Rev. Sam G. Thompson, pastor of the Missouri Avenue Methodist Church, officiated. At the conclusion of the ceremony Mr. and Mrs. Mansker went at once to their cottage, 304 East Tucker street, newly furnished at the direction of the bride.

Mansker has worked for two years as special officer for the Texas & Pacific. Both bride and bridegroom have many friends in Fort Worth.
