

### Autoist Fined For Trip In Wet Concrete

Paul Willanger, 39, an engineer, 6050 Sixth Av. N. W., was convicted in Traffic Court yesterday of driving while under the influence of liquor and negligent driving, reduced from reckless driving.

A drunkenness charge was stricken.

Judge William H. Simmons fined Willanger \$225 and suspended his license for 30 days.

Patrolman Samuel W. Buckley testified that on May 16 Willanger drove about 75 feet through concrete freshly poured to resurface West Dravus Street between 16th and 17th Avenues West.

Buckley said he asked the defendant if he had driven his automobile through the concrete and that Willanger replied:

"No, I was riding a bus."

The officer testified Willanger told him he had had two "shots" of whiskey in a cocktail lounge. Willanger had a strong odor of alcohol on his breath, was unsteady on his feet and refused a drunkometer test, Buckley said.

The defendant did not testify.

Delmar H. Frazier, 30, a Navy sailor, Bremerton, forfeited \$150 bail on a reckless-driving charge. Judge Simmons suspended Frazier's license for 30 days.

Dennis C. O'Brien, 18, a student, Renton, and Delmer Schmidt, 25, of 7019 Jones Av. N. W., forfeited \$30 each on charges of negligent driving.
