Singing in the Drain

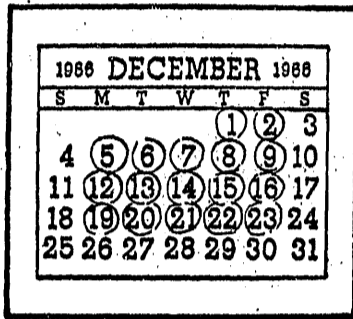
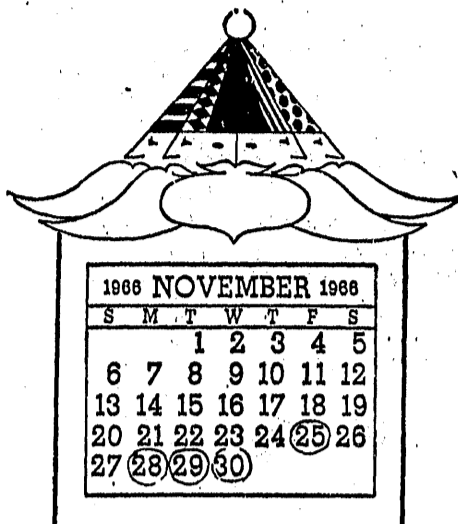
ROCHDALE, England (AP) — From the depths of a curbside drain came a song from Offenbach's operetta "Orpheus in the Underworld." The singer was Wasy! Kwyas-wark!, a 52-year-old laborer. He told the policemen who heard his serenade he had been celebrating and had no idea how he got into the drain. He also had no idea how to get out.

Three policemen tried easing him back to the sidewalk. Wasy!, stuck fast, kept on singing. The fire brigade arrived, then a squad from the municipal drains department with picks, shovels and a pneumatic drill to rip up the pavement. For two hours they assaulted the sidewalk. Wasy! kept on singing.

Finally the police heaved and up popped Wasy!. "Whatever happens I always sing," he said. "It's no good being miserable. And if I hadn't been singing no one would have found me there." The police took him to a hospital for treatment for exposure but decided not to file a charge against him. "How he got down a drain so small is anybody's guess," said one officer. "It was like a cork coming out of a bottle when he was finally freed."
