

# STAFF FOR ASTORIA REGATTA IS NAMED

Naval Flotilla Is Sought for  
Participation in Fete,  
September 2-4.

## MOTORBOAT RACE IS SET

Captain A. M. Wilson, Nephew of  
President, Is Chosen Admiral.  
Log-Rolling and Features  
Contests to Mark Event.

ASTORIA, Or., Aug. 21.—(Special)  
—Under the leadership of F. C. Har-  
ley, chairman, assisted by a committee  
of representative citizens, plans are  
now actively under way for the Twen-  
tieth Astoria Regatta, September 2, 3  
and 4. Other officers of the committee  
are Harry R. Hoefler, vice-chairman;  
Frank Patton, treasurer, and Wallace  
R. Struble, publicity manager. A sec-  
retary will be selected later.

Chairman Harley is formulating a  
programme for the three days' festi-  
vities. The finance committee, which  
has made a partial canvass of Astoria  
business men, report prompt and sub-  
stantial responses to their appeal for  
funds.

The Oregon congressional delegation  
has been requested by the committee  
to use its influence with Secretary of  
the Navy Daniels to obtain the detail  
of a naval flotilla to participate in the  
regatta festivities. It is hoped that a  
substantial unit of the Pacific reserve  
fleet may be obtained.

### Liners to Be Invited.

The Great Northern Pacific Steam-  
ship Company and the San Francisco  
& Portland Steamship Company will  
be invited to participate with their  
big ocean carriers, while invitations  
will be sent to every steamboat com-  
pany operating on the Columbia and  
its tributaries to designate vessels to  
take part in the programme.

A leading feature of the 1915 regat-  
ta will be the championship motorboat  
races of the Pacific Coast, under the  
auspices of the Pacific International  
Powerboat Association. The Astoria  
Motorboat Club has taken this part of  
the affair in hand and is communicat-  
ing with the various speed-boat own-  
ers in the Northwest.

Other features will include log-roll-  
ing contests, log-sawing contests, Fin-  
nish pillow contests and land sports  
of all kinds.

Among the innovations planned by  
the committee will be aviation flights  
(possibly hydro-aeroplane) and exhib-  
its of land and manufactured products  
of Clatsop County. Special prizes will  
be given.

### Race for "Queen" Begins.

A "queen" contest is now on among  
the fairest of Astoria's daughters for  
the honor of reigning monarch of the  
regatta. An added feature this year  
will be the presence of "Father Nep-  
tune," who will escort the "queen"  
from his oceanic realm and present  
her to her royal subjects. Columbia  
River towns are being invited to name  
"maids of honor" to share the royal  
privileges.

Retiring "Admiral" Phil Metschan,  
Jr., in accordance with the usual cus-  
tom of naming his successor, has ap-  
pointed Captain A. M. Wilson, of Port-  
land, to be "admiral" of the Twentieth  
Astoria Annual Regatta. Captain Wil-  
son is a nephew of President Woodrow  
Wilson, and is the Northwestern rep-  
resentative of the Galena-Signal Oil  
Company.
