

SUPPOSED ACCIDENTAL, DEATH TURNS OUT TO HAVE BEEN MURDER.

Clayton, N. C., April 21.—The death of William Mackey near Moses, Union county, April 4th, thought to have been caused by the kick of a horse, turns out to be a homicide. According to information furnished by Sheriff R. T. Mansker, of Clayton, Earl Rayborn, 21 years old, confessed that he killed Mackey with a pipe wrench in defense of Mrs Rayborn, who is blind. Sheriff Mansker alleges that Rayborn said that he tied Mackey to the horses after the deed had been committed. Rayborn is held in \$5,000 bonds, which has not been furnished.
