Crashes kill youths, man

LONGVIEW, Wash. — Teenage twin brothers from Longview, Wash., were killed Thursday in a two-car accident near here.

A separate accident 10 minutes earlier near Woodland claimed the life of a 70-year-old White Salmon man.

The Washington State Patrol, investigating both accidents, said the brothers, Tony J. and Terry E. Mansker, 17, died about 10 p.m. when their Volkswagen was struck by a car that crossed the center line on Washington 4 four miles west of Longview.

Tony was driver of the small car. Another of his passengers, Lisa M. Hollishead, 16, Longview, suffered a broken nose and lacerations and is in St. John's Hospital, Longview.

The driver of the other car, Carl N. Ronney, 34, Longview, also was taken to St. John's with lacerations.

In the Woodland-area accident, a car driven by Harry F. Smith, 70, went into a ditch and rolled over on Washington 503 four miles east of Woodland. A passenger in his car, Gladys B. Kiger, 60, of Bingen was taken to Vancouver Memorial Hospital.

EPA OKs expansion

A "green light" has come from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for the planned expansion of Martin-Marietta's aluminum reduction plant at Goldendale, Wash.

The federal agency's approval of the expansion, which is expected to cost about \$100 million, can become final only after a public comment period that ends July 1. Public comments about the expansion may be sent to Air Compliance Branch, Mail Stop 513, EPA, 1200 6th Avenue, Seattle 98101.

The agency has ruled that the aluminum plant's plans show that air pollution control technology will be used to control emissions at levels lower than those now allowed by the federal agency.

Tillamook fire cause not found

TILLAMOOK — A sifting of ashes Friday by local and state investigators failed to reveal the cause of the fire that destroyed Midway Shake Co. mill here Thursday.

A spokesman in the office of Tillamook Fire Chief Maurice Steinbach said investigators believe the fire started near the west end of the mill.

The shingle and shake mill employed 11 people and was reduced to ashes.

Tillamook Fire Marshal Richard Adams said the loss may be as high as \$300,000.

D.E. Luuddemann
